## DRAFT DAY PROVIDES TWO DIFFERENT AREAS FOR COMPANIES AND TRAINING PROVIDERS TO CONNECT WITH STUDENTS



## **CAREER EXPO**

Through the on-site, traditional career Expo, high school students of all ages are invited to participate in Career Exploration while engaging with local companies.

Students are encouraged to prepare questions and resumes to hand out to participating companies.

## **INTERVIEW AREA**

Seniors' interests and aptitudes data is used to match them with employers based on identified categories of need. This strategic pairing, as well as resources provided in advance to prepare students for interviews, resume writing and interviewing, maximizes opportunities for high-value interactions for all involved.

## **COMPANY & TRAINING PROVIDER FAQ**



#### O: WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I REGISTER?

A: The Career Expo is open to companies and training providers and includes an 8x8 or 8x10 booth space (dependent on location) with electricity, a 6-foot clothed table, two chairs, and booth identification.

Interviewing companies will be assigned one interview table for each interviewer they confirm will attend. Each table will be marked with signage indicating the table number and interviewing company. Additional signage in this space will help direct students to companies offering positions of interest.

#### O: SHOULD I PARTICIPATE IN THE CAREER EXPO BOOTH OR INTERVIEWS? OR BOTH?

A: In the Career Expo, companies and training providers have the opportunity to engage with students in grades 9-12 from participating schools who are interested in skilled, technical professions. This is a great opportunity to encourage students to pursue technical careers, increase brand recognition, and set your organization apart as a community leader in workforce development.

In the Interview Area, companies meet with high school seniors who have been pre-matched based on company hiring needs and student interests and skills. Participation in the Interview Area means companies have or will soon have open, entry-level technical roles. Beyond just interest, seniors who register for interviews may already have industry certifications like OSHA 10 or CTE certificates in relevant subjects. The Be Pro Be Proud team and its volunteers will encourage students to visit company booths before their interview slot.

#### O: HOW MANY PEOPLE SHOULD WE BRING?

A: We recommend bringing at least 2 people for your booth space, 2-4 interviewers, and 2 people for any outdoor expo space.

## Q: MY COMPANY WILL BE ATTENDING MULTIPLE LOCATIONS; HOW DO I REGISTER FOR MORE THAN ONE EVENT?

A: On your registration form, check the box labeled "We plan to attend more than one Draft Day event." A Be Pro Be Proud team member will reach out and support your registration for additional events.

#### O: WHICH SCHOOLS WILL BE AT DRAFT DAY?

A: Visit our website to see a current list of registered schools.

#### O. HOW ARE STUDENTS AND COMPANIES MATCHED?

A. Seniors and companies are matched based on reported student interest and skills and company needs. Companies, schools, and seniors will receive their matches and interview schedules approximately two weeks before each Draft Day event.
